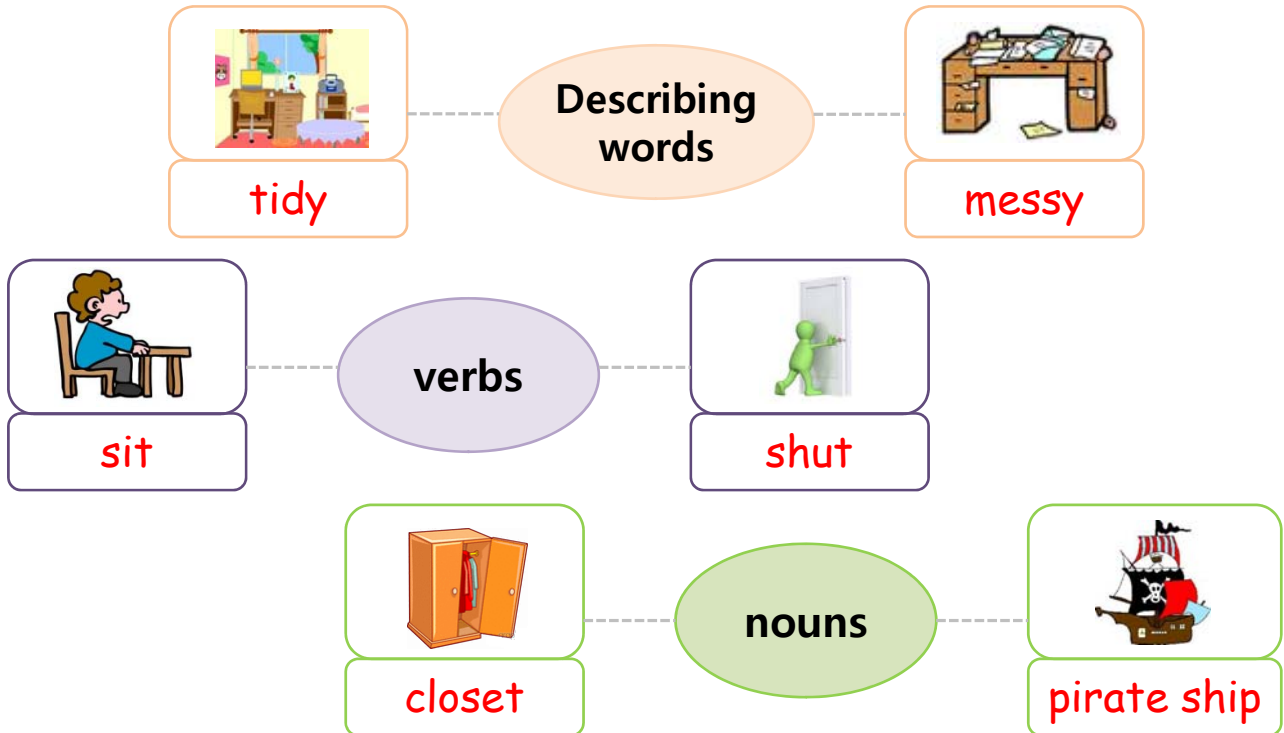

Exclamatory sentence

You can use exclamatory sentences to express your feelings.

Form: **what + a(n) + adjective + noun** (+ subject + verb)

Ex.) It is a smart dog. → **What a smart dog** it is!

1 (a, friend, nice, what) → What a nice friend Sam is!
(=Sam is a nice friend.)

2 (tidy, what, a, room) → What a tidy room it is!
(=It is a tidy room.)

3 (what, bridge, a, long) → What a long bridge it is!
(=It is very long bridge.)
