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In some ways, plants and animals are the same. For example, both need to defend themselves. Plants do this in many different ways. Poison ivy is one example. It uses poison to make animals not want to touch it. Other plants use poison, too. But they use it to keep animals from eating them, like the foxglove. Still, other plants use needles to protect themselves. These sharp points keep animals away. Cactuses use this kind of defense. Some plants have really strange defenses. Some make sweet juices that ants like. The ants then protect the plant from other bugs. Other plants, like the stone plant in Africa, use disguises. The stone plant looks like rocks. Although plants can be dangerous, there are some things we can do to protect ourselves. We can wear gloves and stay on trails. This will keep us safe while we enjoy nature.
