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A flood happens when water covers land that is usually dry. Areas near rivers and lakes are higher-risk zones. Floods are usually caused by hurricanes or other weather events that bring a lot of rain. In “slow-rising” floods, water levels rise over a period of days. Flash floods happen quickly, often in cities. The worst flood ever happened in China in 1931. It rained heavily. The ground couldn't take in the water because it had been dry for a long time, and many people died. If you live close to water, be prepared. During a bad storm, take shelter and go to higher ground or a higher floor. Floodwater is dirty and spreads germs, so never play in it. Although floods are scary, some are helpful. For example, they cover land with silt, which makes it better for farming. People will always need to live near water, so scientists are trying to make stronger levees and to predict storms better. This knowledge will make us safer in the future.
