reef	noun	암초	a long hill of rock or coral in the ocean	A healthy reef is full of sea animals.
resource	noun	자원	something of value that can be used or sold	The resources of the ocean are very important for feeding the people of the world.
rig	noun	굴착 장치	a building with special equipment for drilling for oil and gas	Oil companies sometimes build a rig in the sea to drill for oil.
salvage	adj	구조	related to saving something of value from a wreck	Salvage teams sometimes find wrecks and get valuable things from them.
shipwreck	noun	난파, 조난	a ship that is damaged and usually at the bottom of the ocean	A shipwreck can be an interesting place for divers to visit.
