travel	verb	여행하다	to go from one place to another place	Last weekend we traveled to the country.
opposite	prep	~의 맞은 편에	across from or on the other side of something	The bank was opposite the post office.
captain	noun	주장	a person who is the leader of a team	John was the captain of our football team.
crew	noun	승무원, 승무원 전원	a group of people who work on a large transport vehicle	There were twelve people in the crew of the airplane.
first mate	noun	1등 항해사	a helper for the captain of a ship	The first mate can watch the ship when the captain is asleep.
yard	noun	활대	a pole on a ship that helps hold the sails	The sailors walked on the yards to check the sails.
mast	noun	돛대	tall upright post that supports the sails of a boat	The strong wind of the storm broke the ship's mast.
ratline	noun	줄사다리	a type of rope ladder on a ship	Climbing ratlines in a storm is very dangerous.
knot	noun	매듭	a fastening made by tying together the ends of a piece or pieces of string, rope, etc.	Alexander could not untie the knot, so he cut it with his knife.
slippery	adj	미끄러운	having a surface that is smooth and hard to move on or hold onto	The deck of a ship is slippery in a storm.
overboard	adv	배 밖에	going over the side of a boat or ship and into the water	Peter fell overboard, so we had to go back and pick him up.

mend	verb	수선하다	to repair something that was broken, making it usable again	When the sails get ripped, the sailors have to mend them.
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
